##### **From the Minister:**

In his letter to the Galatians Paul says:

*The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.*

These things are about the practical effects of the Christian life, and one of the important things is joy.

Jesus was someone who exhibited joy in his life. He wasn't afraid to enjoy fellowship with all sorts of people, some of whom were condemned by the orthodox religious attitudes of his day. He liked dining with his friends, he wasn't afraid to use humour in his teaching. He enjoyed the beauties of nature. St Paul showed the same spirit. Looking back on his ministry, he acknowledges the many times of deep unhappiness, but the joy outweighed them all. From his own experience he could speak of joy as the gift of the Spirit. It followed on that when the church came into being joy was one of the characteristics of Christianity which led to the rapid extension of the church. Even in the time of persecution the enemies of the Christian church had to acknowledge that there was a quality of happiness about the early Christians which aroused curiosity and won converts. In all the difficulties that they faced they were supported by their faith which gave them joy in believing and joy in life.

Today we live in much easier times in many ways. But we still should go in search of finding and expressing a

sense of joy in our lives. There are many ways in which we find joy in living. For instance we could obviously think of our homes and families, maybe our work or our fellowship with others or anything that gives us satisfaction. There are different types of activities which make some demand upon us and offer, by return, a kind of fulfilment. They also have about them a quality of permanence which distinguishes them from the things which simply give us pleasure. If we work hard at things, concentrate on them, we gradually become more and more proficient. Concentration is actually very close, in some ways, to the practice of prayer. It is about settling ourselves and centring our attention. Simone Weil, the French mystical writer and philosopher wrote that "Prayer is the orientation of all the attention of which the soul is capable towards God". This means that all our work and indeed our leisure can be transformed. Simone Weil goes on to say that there is something akin to prayer in study, for instance. "To study for the sake of truth," she says "is likewise and in the very same effort of attention to pray." She adds too that such prayer is answered for "every time a human being succeeds in making an effort of attention with the sole idea of increasing his grasp of truth, he acquires a greater aptitude for grasping it."
