### **Dedication of the First World War Roll of Honour**

This service was held at Downpatrick on Sunday afternoon, 18<sup>th</sup> November. It both commemorated the centenary of the end of the First World War and included the dedication of the new Roll of Honour, which was undertaken by the Moderator of the General Synod, the Rt Rev Colin Campbell. Everyone who attended received a copy of the fifty page Roll of Honour which Downpatrick congregation has published on behalf of the denomination, It contains the names of the 588 men and women who served in the Great War plus biographies of the 98 servicemen who gave their lives. As well as the minister and the moderator those taking part in the service included Rev Bridget Spain, Rev Brian Moodie, Rev Paul Reid, Sue Steers and Jeffrey Martin. Laura Patterson was the organist, Jack Steers played the Last Post on the trumpet and Laura Neill played some laments on the bagpipes. The collection raised £855.90 which has been shared between the Poppy Appeal and Help for Heroes. Copies of the Roll of Honour are now available for purchase, price £5 each, all of which also goes to the Poppy Appeal and Help for Heroes. Copies are also available by post from either the minister (223 Upper Lisburn Road, Belfast BT10 0LL) or church secretary, Miss Mary Stewart (9A Buckshead Road, Downpatrick BT30 8JB). Please add £1.26 for postage in the UK (£3.85 elsewhere). So far over £200 has been raised for the charities from sales. Copies have also been sent to libraries, record offices and museums all over the British Isles.

### **Church Repair Work**

The repair work in Downpatrick has all been completed and we are now preparing to have the church interior painted. The work to restore the main doors and the steps in Ballee is now underway and we hope to see this completed in the near future. At Clough we are exploring the possibility of a charity restoring the Murland mausoleum, one of the most architecturally significant tombs in Northern Ireland.

### **Christmas Services**

As well as the Candlelight Carol Service on 12<sup>th</sup> December each congregation has held its own Carol Service. At Clough the children of the Sunday School led the service on 16<sup>th</sup> December. The Sunday School enjoyed a trip to see the pantomime 'Little Bo-Peep's Christmas Mix-Up' at the Down Arts Centre on Friday, 7<sup>th</sup> December. Over the year Clough Sunday School have purchased charity gifts through Christian Aid to help improve the lives of others and have purchased a goat and a sheep for families in Ethiopia and a hand pump for a family in South Sudan. Clough Sunday School Christmas party was held on Saturday, 22<sup>nd</sup> December. Ballee Carol Service was held on Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> December, led by Sunday School members and teachers. The Sunday School outing will be held to Lisburn Bowl on Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> December. Downpatrick Carol Service was also held on 23<sup>rd</sup> December with the service being led by members of the congregation including the Sunday School and younger members of the church. The Downpatrick Sunday School outing – a trip to the pantomime Snow White by the Belvoir Players - was supported by over 60 people and took place on Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> December.

### **Funerals**

Hugh Robinson died suddenly on Sunday, 25<sup>th</sup> November after a period in hospital in the Downe and the Royal Victoria Hospital. A life-long member of the church he was a former treasurer of Clough for 26 years. Hugh was very well known in the local farming community and was a founder member of the Seaforde Working Vintage Club and did a lot of work in relation to vintage farm vehicles and their restoration, helping to raise money for charity in the process. This was reflected in the very large attendance at his funeral which took place at Clough on Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> November followed by burial in the church yard. The funeral was conducted by Rev Dr David Steers and Rev Robert McKee. Our deepest sympathy goes to Hugh's sister Marjorie and to the whole family circle.

Myrtle McBride died on Saturday, 8<sup>th</sup> December after a period of illness. A life-long member of Downpatrick Myrtle had grown up in the house that originally stood at the corner of the church on Stream Street. Myrtle was the treasurer of Downpatrick for more than thirty years until her recent retirement, bringing great care and clarity to all her annual reports for the church. She also undertook the essential job of treasurer for the joint ministry between the three congregations. The esteem in which Myrtle was held was illustrated by her election as an elder to which position she was ordained by the Presbytery of Antrim as recently as September. Myrtle began her working life in Melia's electrical shop before becoming an air traffic controller with the RAF and later working for many years at Knockevin Special School. There was a very large attendance at Myrtle's funeral which was held in the church on Tuesday, 11<sup>th</sup> December, followed by burial in the church yard. The service and was conducted by Rev Dr David Steers who read a tribute prepared by her brother in law Arthur Gibson. Matthew, one of Myrtle's grandchildren, read Psalm 121 during the service. Our deepest sympathy goes out to Samuel and to David, Neill and Jane, to her daughters in law Sharon and Lisa, her grandchildren Matthew, Jack and Ella and her sisters Jean, Anne and Jennifer, and the whole family circle.
