Funeral

Adam Brown died on Thursday, 19th December in Blair House, Newtownards where he had been resident for a few years. A loyal and devoted member of Downpatrick Church since 1993 he was one of the members who worked hard to keep the graveyard and church grounds neat and tidy and, as a keen gardener, regularly brought flowers in to the church for the communion table. As well as a gardener Adam was also a farmer and he combined his farming with 30 years as a policeman, serving through the most difficult and testing years of the Troubles. In his youth Adam had also been a very successful athlete winning an Irish Gold Medal, being part of a winning team in many championships and representing the police in meetings all over the UK and in Europe. Our deepest sympathy goes to Edna, and to their children Carol, Raymond, Alison and Jennifer, to their grandchildren Christopher, Stuart, Emma, Robyn and Jamie, and the whole family circle. Adam's funeral took place at S. Clarke & Son's Funeral Directors, Newtownards, on Tuesday, 24th December followed by committal at Loughview Cemetery, Comber and was conducted by Rev Dr David Steers.
