God's Temple

The word *contemplative* derives from a root that means to set aside a place of worship or to reserve a cleared space in front of an altar. In Hebrew and Christian Scriptures, a contemplative stance is obvious. The Israelites cleared space for worship with the Ark of the Covenant and finally with their temple. Jesus honoured the temple worship of his Jewish tradition but also tried to enlighten his people to realize that sacred buildings, rituals, and rules are meant to bring us into the awareness of the divine presence in us and in all of those around us. Jesus drew our attention to the doctrine of the divine indwelling in a radical declaration that he himself was the temple (John 2:19). . . . Paul elaborates on Jesus' teaching of the doctrine of divine indwelling by declaring that not just Jesus' but *our* body too is the temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19). How marvellous! The Creator of the universe resides within our being.

Visit to Poland

Sue and I will be visiting Poland at the end of July/start of August as part of an historical tour and pilgrimage to the sites of what was called the Minor Reformed Church or the Polish Brethren. This year is the 450th anniversary of the foundation of the town of Raków where they established a printing press and an academy and developed theological views that were broad and tolerant, ideas enshrined in what was called the Racovian Catechism. In the 16th and 17th century Poland was characterised by an outpouring of radical new ideas although these were suppressed later in the counter-reformation. Nevertheless, the ideas spread out from Poland to other countries and influenced other churches. As part of a group we will be visiting sites connected with this historical group.
