Planning application Downpatrick

Planning permission has been granted for a developer to build nine dwellings on the site of the former clinic on Pound Lane on the land next to Downpatrick Church. On our behalf Mary Stewart has done an excellent job of making the planning office aware of our concerns about this, not least with regard to our status as a listed building and the dangers of building too close to the ancient wall that is the boundary to our property, as well as concern about the lowering of the former clinic site by over a metre. A direct result of this has been that the site of the proposed properties has been moved back to not interfere with the sightlines of the Church. The details can be consulted online at Newry, Mourne and Down District Council Planning Office and also in the Church. We are grateful to Mary for keeping an eye on this.

Women's League

Clough Gift Aid

All members (of all churches) are invited to sign up for gift aid. However, Clough has new forms that are available in the Church and everyone who would like to join the scheme is urged to do so. Anyone who pays tax is invited to sign one of these forms which means that of everything you pay to the church in a year one quarter can be claimed in the form of gift aid. It doesn't cost you a penny more in direct giving but it diverts money that would have gone to the Exchequer in tax to the Church instead. There are new forms and we do need everyone who wants to help in this way to sign a form, even if you have signed one in the past.
