The organ was demonstrated by our organist Alfie McClelland who played as a voluntary the 'Chorus of the Hebrew Slaves' (Speed Your Journey). The first reading, Psalm 150, was given by Amanda Ramsey. We were also delighted to welcome the Quoile Area WI Choir with their conductor Isabel Keenan and accompanist Kathleen Gill. During the service the minister thanked church treasurer, George Hay, for his very generous donation towards the purchase of the organ and thanked and welcomed Steven Corry who was present and who had supplied the organ. The service was followed by refreshments in the church hall and most of the very large congregation present were able to stay for tea. It was also pleasing to welcome a number of clergy to the service both from the denomination and from local churches. The collection totalled £860.
