### **Harvest Services**

We have had a very successful series of harvest services in October. At Downpatrick we welcomed the Rev Dr John Nelson as guest preacher and the Harlandic Male Voice Choir conducted by Elaine Hawthorne to lead our worship. Laura Patterson played the organ and the church was specially decorated to represent the changing seasons of the year as well as the sacrifice of those who served in the First World War. At the service we also launched the new colour leaflets put together by Mary Stewart, our church secretary, which give an account of the three members of the congregation who gave their lives in the First World War. These are available in the church if you have not yet got one. A presentation of a cheque for £350 was also made to Ann Cooper, Principal of Knockevin School, by Laura Neill, Zak Sraney and Robyn Nixon on behalf the Sunday School. Following the service everyone enjoyed the refreshments and a time of fellowship.

At Ballee the walls were decorated by the Sunday School with the first verse of the hymn "Go work in my vineyard..." and each window was superbly decorated with a different line from this. Our visiting preacher was the Very Rev William McMillan and we welcomed back the Bailliesmills Accordion Band who played at the service. The organ was played by John Strain. Many of those present also supported Ross Kelly who is fasting in November to help raise funds for Nicola's Campaign to Beat MS. Again there were refreshments after the service and it was good to see so many staying for this.

At Clough I was the preacher and we welcomed the Clare Chorale under the direction of Sheelagh Greer to lead our worship. A large and accomplished choir their singing filled the church which was beautifully decorated for the occasion. Alfie McClelland played the organ. A letter of thanks was read from Rhode Moles, Principal of Cumran Primary School, thanking the Sunday School for the money they had collected towards the purchase of a defibrillator for the school. Afterwards we again were delighted to have so many stay behind for refreshments and fellowship in the hall. A very big thank you goes to all who helped decorate the churches (and who helped with all the clearing up afterwards), those who helped with refreshments and those who assisted in the organisation in any way as well as to our visiting preachers and musicians who all helped to create such meaningful acts of worship.
