##### From the Minister:

I hope everyone is returning suitably refreshed from the summer. Sue and myself had a fascinating time in Poland and at a date to be announced I will give an illustrated talk about the story of the Polish Brethren, a church of the radical reformation which flourished in Poland for about 100 years and which we were looking at while we were in Poland, visiting historic sites connected with this group which was suppressed by the authorities in 1658.

At the end of June we celebrated John Strain's 40 years as organist at Ballee at a joint service at Ballee on 30<sup>th</sup> June. There was a good attendance as we sang hymns specially chosen by John and heard John's reasons for appreciating them. At the end of the service a special presentation was made to John before we shared in refreshments in the hall. We are greatly blessed in having John's skill at the organ at Ballee.

I am continuing to act as minister in charge of the Dunmurry congregation and so need to be away from the pulpit from time to time to be there. Following the retirement of the Rev Norman Hutton the Banbridge congregation will also be without a minister and from the start of September I have been asked to be minister in charge of that congregation. However, I will usually be able to preach at Dunmurry and Banbridge on

the same Sundays so this means that I will not need to be away from our own churches with any more frequency.

The death of the Rev Tom Banham has been a very sad loss to the denomination. Tom died suddenly on 14<sup>th</sup> August and his funeral was held at Roselawn Crematorium on Monday, 20<sup>th</sup> August. Our churches were represented at his funeral and John Strain played the organ. Many of our members worked with Tom in different committees and organisations over the years and he was someone who made a tremendous impact on the denomination. We remember him with great affection as a minister and friend to many.

Keith Parke has accepted a call to the congregations of Newry and Warrenpoint. We wish him and the congregations every future happiness.
